Villiers Park is on the A10 between Cambridge and Royston, with easy access from the M11, and a couple of minutes walk from Foxton railway station.

By Road

From the Midlands and the North join the A14 at Huntingdon travelling towards Cambridge. As you approach Cambridge, move into the centre or right hand lane to join the M11. Leave the M11 at Junction 11 and at the roundabout, turn right onto the A10 towards Royston. After about 4.5 miles, the A10 crosses a level crossing. Ignore the sign to Foxton village. After about 200 yards, Villiers Park is signposted on the left.

From London and the South you can take either the A10 or M11. From the M11, take Junction 11 and follow the directions given above. Using the A10, Foxton is about 6 miles north of Royston. Ignore the right-hand turn to Foxton village and stay on the A10. About 200 yards before you reach the level crossing, Villiers Park is signposted with a right turn into the drive.

By Rail

Foxton station is on the line between London Kings Cross and Cambridge. There are hourly trains in both directions. Please note that not all trains on this line stop at Foxton. From Foxton station, walk down the platform towards the level crossing. Turn left into Station Road. After about 200 yards, turn right into Hall Close. Walk straight ahead to the end of the cul-de-sac and take the footpath in front of you through a wooden gate. Turn left down the drive and go to reception.

By Bus

There is an hourly bus service (route 26) between Royston and Cambridge. The nearest bus stops are near the railway station in Station Road. Turn down Station Road away from the level crossing and after about 50 yards turn into Hall Close. Walk straight ahead to the end of the cul-de-sac and take the footpath in front of you through a wooden gate. Turn left down the drive and go to reception.

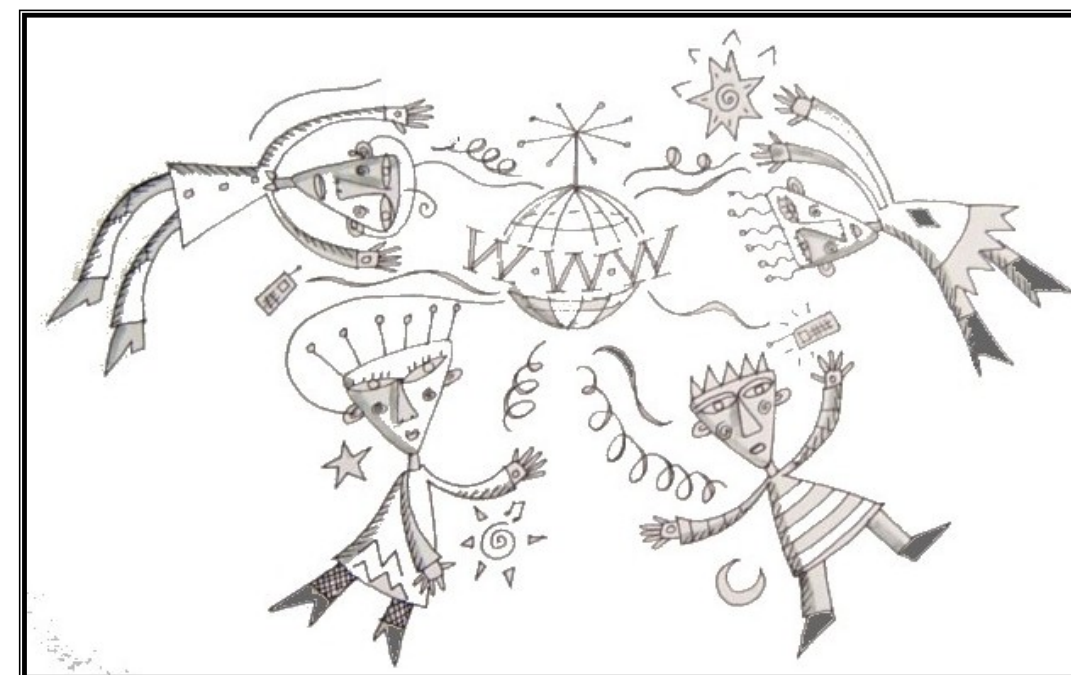
